About Smart Futures

Smart Futures is a collaborative government-industry-education programme, managed by Science Foundation Ireland in partnership with the Engineers Ireland STEPS programme and over 50 organisations nationwide, promoting STEM careers to second-level students.

We provide the necessary training, tools and support to our volunteers to give career talks aimed at secondary schools across the country. Volunteers can contribute as much or as little time as suits; the programme is flexible and designed to fit around a busy schedule and at any location.

Why it matters?

Greater student engagement is needed to increase the number of students taking STEM related courses and to provide talented workers for the future. Research shows that the key factor influencing young people's career choices is that they will fit in. Together we need to challenge stereotypes so young people can see and identify with the diversity of people that work in STEM. Having a role model can be hugely empowering, encouraging them to explore opportunities they might otherwise miss.
